## Our Cover

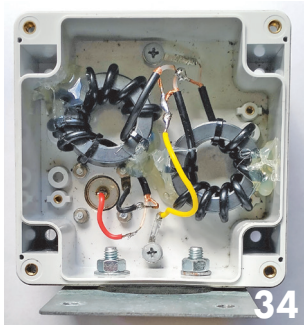
