Public Information Coordinator's Report

The date for the 5th Annual Auburn Hamfest is July 20, 2024.

March 4th – Dave (KC9YY) Jeff (KB9QG) and John (KD9QDL) did some field testing with 10, 20, 40, 80 M hamstick in the horizontal position. We used the center frequency for each position for each to figure out SWR.

In the recent past, I was asked to help a fellow ham put a 20 Meter Hamstick dipole on his attic. This should be easy to setup right? Armed with an antenna analyzer, we set to work adjusting the stringers that came with the antennas. One detail was left out of the direction for tuning. The stinger must not extend inside antenna tube very far. So, using the approach if the frequency is too low, make the stinger longer or if the frequency is to high shorten the stringer. After several hours and not getting the frequency in the 20 Meter band I gave to for the day. That night I did some research on the internet and found that you have to cut the stinger to get the antenna to tune up properly. The dilemma is if you cut the stringer to short you have to buy a new stringer. I have at home a Buddipole antenna. It uses telescopic elements for tuning in the dipole configurations. I took a pair of telescopic stringers from the Buddipole and found that it would work on the Hamsticks. Now I could tune the Hamsticks across the band and not be concerned about being to short or going inside the antenna tube. Using the telescopic stringers allows the use of the 80M, 40M, 20M and 10M band to tune the lowest VSWR in the frequency range where you want to operate. If you need a different frequency range, you just change the length of the stinger. Using the telescopic stringers make the Hamstick more versatile.


Dave Beltz (K9TZ) of the Northeastern Indiana Amateur Radio Association (NIARA) recently conducted some experiments with hamsticks, spurred by an article from NIARA about using telescopic stingers with them instead of the whips typically provided. His findings were quite impressive.

Initially, Dave set up his Xiegu G90 on his kitchen table and tried out a 10m hamstick with a mag mount. To his surprise, he managed to make contacts as far away as Japan, the Cayman Islands, and Belize. Encouraged by this success, he then tested a 20m hamstick with similar results. Using the tripod setup with a 40m hamstick to his three-season room on a camera tripod increased his reach even further, pulling in contacts from more countries.

For his final test, Dave moved the antenna outdoors and extended the mast approximately 7 feet, using 10m, 20m, and 40m hamsticks. Even outdoors, he was able to make even more contacts with stations both domestically and internationally, including some Parks on the Air (POTA) stations as a hunter.

Dave's assessment of the hamsticks is overwhelmingly positive, particularly in conjunction with the Xiegu G90 operating at 20 watts. He found that using them as a vertical antenna worked exceptionally well for him, especially considering his HOA restrictions. His next experiment will involve testing two Horizontal Hamsticks, likely aiming to explore further options for maximizing his setup's performance within the limitations of his living situation.

Well, it is finally here. The eclipse of midafternoon. April 8th, for about an hour, the moon will pass in front of the sun creating a Lunar Eclipse. As I have been reporting, the Mid-State ARC has been requested by Public Service agencies of Johnson County to provide a substantial backup to the communications systems within the county. About 18 MARC members will be stationed at firehouses, emergency management centers and the Club radio room. A LEO and fire representative will also be at each location with our HAMs. In addition to the Clubs 2 repeaters, VHF/UHF, there are 8 additional simplex frequencies that will be used as backup to the repeaters. Being split across both VHF and UHF the simplex will be used for voice and Winlink communications. Testing started a couple years ago for county coverage of simplex back to the centrally located radio room. Then tests performed for location to location that were spread all across the county. When news of the upcoming eclipse and Club involvement request came to us, we responded with a strong "CAN DO!" Because we already knew the abilities of the membership, the equipment and frequencies not in use by other Amateur clubs and operators in the area. Additionally, the repeater for IDHS and both 75M and 40M assignments will be monitored at the radio room. Tests were repeated to assure county coverage of simplex. Meetings of the involved agencies were attended. Mid-State Amateur Radio Club is ready to stand up to the slogan: "When all else fails, there's Amateur radio." Latest weather prediction: Clear, 75 degrees.

Spring in Indiana can mean severe weather. Amateur radio plays a valuable role in providing "ground truth" observations of weather phenomena that are too low to the ground or too small to be seen by weather radar. You can best serve the National Weather Service by becoming a trained weather spotter. Most NWS forecast offices that cover Indiana offer some sort of severe weather spotter training. Many of these spotter training sessions are in-person while some NWS offices offer virtual spotter training. Check the NWS office for your area to find out more about severe weather.




