By now, I hope you have read the new ARES Plan that was approved by the ARRL Board of Directors. If not, you can read the plan at <u>http://www.arrl.org/files/file/Public%20Service/ARES/ARES%20Plan</u> <u>%20-%20rev%2001-30%20-19.pdf</u>.

For the past 5 years, Arizona ARES, has operated with the requirements of what is now called a "Level 2 ARES member" (minus the EC-001 requirement) to be considered a deployable asset. This has not changed. If you have not taken the 4 ICS on-line training classes, now is the time to start them. They are self-paced and still free. They can be found at <u>www.training.fema.gov/IS</u>.

The new plan mentions ARES credentialing. At this time, there are no served partners in Arizona that will recognize an ARES Credential. The only credentials they will recognize are those issued by their agency. Many of the agency/partners have additional requirements including additional training and in some cases background checks.

For Arizona ARES, our operations and requirements will remain status quo as we have had the new requirements in place for many years. Arizona is definitely a front runner when it comes to emcomm in the ham community. We have heard these comments many times from state and federal agencies over the last few years.

As time progresses, ARES members will be required to sign up on the new ARRL ARES Connect system in order to be recognized by the ARRL as ARES members. However, we will continue to use our local websites and such to track your qualifications and training.

Local Government Liaison, Virgil Silhanek K7VZ

Arizona legislators have been busy as we've been tracking 5 bills introduced which address distracted driving and prohibitions on texting while driving. Each bill has been reviewed by several sources, including ARRL legal counsel, who has informed us that the verbiage is good. Enacting a statewide law creates a standard set of rules that law enforcement can follow vs. counties, cities, and other jurisdictions enacting varying levels of laws. So far, SB1165 has progressed the furthest, passing the Senate and being transferred to the House where it has to go through the same approval processes.

Description: Volunteer emergency communications operators/groups, using amateur radio, have been providing backup communications to public safety for nearly 100 years. Event planners, public safety officials, and emergency managers at all levels of government utilize their services. Often, amateur radio services have been used when other forms of communications have failed or have been disrupted. Today, nearly all the states/territories have incorporated some level of participation by amateur radio auxiliary communication operators into their TICPs and SCIPs. This course focuses on auxiliary communications interoperability, the relationship between the COML and the volunteer, emergency operations center (EOC) etiquette, on-the-air etiquette, FCC rules and regulations, auxiliary communications training and planning, and emergency communications deployment. It is intended to supplement and standardize an operator's experience and knowledge of emergency amateur radio communications in a public safety context. This course is two days long (10 hours each day) and is limited to 30 students.

Target Audience: This class is designed for those auxiliary emergency communicators and groups who volunteer to provide backup emergency radio communications support to public safety agencies. Typically, this includes amateur radio and Radio Emergency Associated Communications Team (REACT) communicators, but may include other volunteer emergency communicators

Registration: This course requires self-registration through the State's online registration system at <u>dematraining.az.gov</u>. It is recommended that participants enroll no later than 14 days prior to the start of the course using the above *Event ID or Course Name*. First time users will be required to create an account prior to enrollment. *You must provide a valid email address and phone number for contact information*. Instructions are included on page 2 of this bulletin.

- **a.** Click on the "WebForms" link under the resources section on the right side of the page.
- **b.** Choose the "Request DEMA Training Portal Account", complete the form and click submit. Your request will be reviewed within one business day and you will receive an email response with further instructions to complete the setup process.

3. If you have an existing Acadis Portal Account

- **a.** Log in with your email address and password.
- b. If you have forgotten your password, clink on the "Reset your password" link under the password field. You will need to have the email address you used to sign up. If you have forgotten your login email address please contact us at 602-464-6225 or email <u>training@azdema.gov</u> for assistance.

4. Search for an event

- **a.** Once logged in, click on or hover over "Training & Events" (top navigation pane) then click on "Browse or Sign up for Training".
- **b.** You will see the list of available training.
- **c.** On the left navigation pane you can search by keywords or other criteria. To the right you'll see if the class is open with an option to register or waitlist.
- **d.** To view the training event details click on the event name.

5. Two ways to register

- **a.** In the Training Event Details screen click on "Request Enrollment" on the bottom right. After clicking the link, you'll be brought to a screen that will confirm the event name and your contact information.
