The top score this year was submitted by Anna, KE1BYL in CA – 6680 points with the top QSO and multiplier totals, as well – 167 QSOs and 40 multipliers. Anna moved up in W6 from second-place in August Nice job! The number two and three scores both came with identical 115-QSO totals by Chris, WA4YG operating from K1ZZI in GA with 4485 points and Matt, W1MSW operating at the station of KK1W in MA with 3680. Igor, N1YX at K1RX in NH was right behind Matt with 3416 points. It looks like no matter where you were, getting a 1st-district call sign involved was a distinct plus!

This time out we have our first DX entry – Rich, AL4S made an appearance from Alaska using the station of KL7AA. We also have repeat winners! From Canada's Ontario province – Ken, VE3IKT – and Matt, W1MSW made it to the top again.
