

## ARRL November Phone Sweepstakes 2017 Preliminary Results

We all hoped that it wouldn't happen, but conditions were even worse than in 2016...and 2018 might continue the trend. The 10 and 15 meter bands produced very few QSOs, 20 meters mostly closed up shop before sunset, and 40 meter propagation was spotty throughout the night. A total of 401,242 contacts were reported, roughly equal to last year. Band-by-band QSO numbers as a percentage of the total show a fairly typical distribution for a sunspot-starved year:

160 meters	<0.01% (33 QSOs)
80 meters	25.4%
40 meters	33.8%
20 meters	32.5%
15 meters	8.3%
10 meters	<0.01% (32 QSOs)

With Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands still reeling from a devastating hurricane season, Clean Sweeps were at a premium, and many Top Ten finishers in the Unlimited categories failed to find one or more mults. Only 78 stations worked them all, compared to 162 last year and 296 in 2015.
