The Winners

K5QE defended his position at the top of the Limited Multioperator category while W2SZ repeats as the winner of the Unlimited Multioperator category. This is Number 28 for the W2SZ crew in the top spot for the June VHF Contest!

VE3OIL moved to the top of the Classic Rover category after being Number 2 in 2017. K2EZ returned to the top of Limited Rover category after winning last year.

VE3SMA achieved first place in the Rover Unlimited category - up from a 4th-place finish in 2017.

The Records – Rover Categories

No new records were set in the Classic Rover category but K2EZ set a new record for the Hudson Division in the Limited Rover category.

Three new records were set in the Unlimited Rover category - K1SIG in the New England Division, NØLD in the West Gulf Division, and VE3SMA in Canada.



Jim, K5ND/R entered as a Limited Rover and activated seven grids. Jim managed 145 QSOs, 69 grids, and about a dozen explanations of what he was doing to passersby! His fine rover set-up was an IC-9100 into 10-element 2-meter and 70-cm Yagis plus a 6-meter stressed Moxon beam. The antennas were on a 25-foot push-up mast.
