

Step 3

Enter your Postcard Password

Note! This applies only to USA licensees!

1. Go to the Postcard Password Entry webpage:
<https://lotw.arrl.org/lotw/password>
2. Enter your callsign in the callsign box and enter the password exactly as it is on the card in the password box. The password is eight alpha-numeric characters above the address and batch numbers on the front of your postcard. The password is case sensitive.
3. Click SUBMIT PASSWORD
