While looking for a way to easily check VSWR before getting on HF, Mark Persons, WØMH, designed a relay that allows convenient antenna checking and tuner adjustments without putting noticeable power on the air to cause interference. His four-port RF switch handles the radio, a dummy load, the antenna, and an antenna analyzer.
