Dear FCC Commissioners:

Mobilcomm supports the petition for Rulemaking filed by the LMCC seeking new spectrum allocations for private wireless users. We are pleased that the commission quickly placed this petition on public notice.

We are a two-way radio sales and service company located in Cincinnati, Ohio. We have been in business for over 52 years and employ 110 people. In our business we use two-way radios to dispatch our fleet of service technicians that repair communications equipment for Public Safety agencies, hospitals, universities, transit systems, factories and businesses. All of these wireless radio users provide numerous important services to our local economy.

Recently we have experienced a lack of private radio spectrum for use by our customers. Their communications needs are going unanswered. Cellular and other commercial systems can't provide the on site coverage that is needed in hospitals, universities and factories. They also can't provide the instant communications so vitally necessary for Public Safety agencies. While Cellular and PCS may be the answer for some, it isn't the answer for our customers.

The lack of spectrum is hurting our business and the ability of our customers to efficiently provide services to their customers. New spectrum is vital to the growth of our business and would provide many jobs in Cincinnati. Without this spectrum our customers will be unable to contact their personnel in the field. Please help us by allocating new private radio spectrum for our use.

I urge you to act quickly on this petition for rulemaking, since the problem associated with the lack of spectrum will only increase.
