In 1899, the Navesink "Twin Lights" Lighthouse in Highlands, New Jersey, was the site of Guglielmo Marconi's first public US demonstration of the wireless telegraph. In 2022, the New Jersey Emergency Communications Team honored Marconi by activating Navesink for the 2022 International Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend, an event that comes up every August.
